Proposition A

Shall Ordinance No. 95-034 be approved; shall the project for the expansion, renovation, reconstruction and improvement of the Noel Wein Library be approved; shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough incur debt and issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed two million dollars (\$2,000,000)?

The library expansion project consists of the construction of approximately 20,000 square feet of additional space to the Noel Wein Library and the modification of existing space to more effectively utilize the space after the expansion. The total construction cost is estimated to be \$40,000,000, and the annual maintenance and operation cost of the project is projected to be \$108,000.

PASSED

* A **"Yes"** Vote Would Approve The Project And Authorization Of The Library Bond. – 8165

Proposition B

Shall Sections 3.08.141 and 3.08.142 of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Code of Ordinances be enacted as follows? These sections will provide for limitations on the maximum allowable tax revenues for the Fairbanks North Star Borough. Under Section 3.08.141 the borough will be able to levy or impose only the same amount of taxes for one fiscal year as the borough levied or imposed for the preceding year, except that the borough can increase the amount of taxes levied or imposed (a) to adjust for inflation; (b) to take into account new buildings and land coming onto tax rolls; (c) make new payments on bonds; (d) pay for services approved by voters; (e) pay for new legal judgments entered against the borough; and (f) pay for expenses in emergencies. Section 3.08.142 provides a formula and definitions for the limitations of Section 3.08.141.

FAILED

A **"Yes"** vote means that the new sections of the code will be adopted, become law and unable to be modified or negated for a period of two years. – 7118

* A **"No"** vote means that the initiative will be defeated; however, the current tax cap in the FNSB Code of Ordinances will remain in effect. – 7266

Proposition C

Shall Subsection 3.08.147 (A), (B) and (C) of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Code of Ordinances be repealed? These provisions limit refunding of taxes raised in excess of the amount permitted by the tax cap provisions of Section 3.08.145 and provide for adjustments to reflect the correct tax computation.

PASSED

* A **"Yes"** Vote Will Repeal The Sections Listed. - 7214

A **"No"** Vote Will Keep The Sections Listed As Law. – 6346

Proposition

Shall the bond authorization in Ordinance No. 96-009 be approved; shall the following school construction, renovation and upgrade projects be approved; and shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough incur debt and issue general obligation bonds not to exceed Sixty-Four Million Two Hundred Ten Thousand One Hundred Twenty-Nine Dollars (\$64,210,129) for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquisition of property for, purchase, site preparation, construction, improvement and equipping the following education capital improvements:

The estimated additional annual maintenance and operations cost is \$805,000 for the new junior high school and \$550,000 for the West Valley High School addition. No additional annual maintenance and operations costs are anticipated for the other projects. The total amount of bonds issued is debt of the Fairbanks North Star Borough only. State reimbursement is subject to annual appropriation. With full State reimbursement for debt service on eligible projects, the approximate annual amount of taxes on \$100,000 of assessed real property value (based on 1995 assessed valuation) to retire this proposed debt is \$16.10.

SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AREAWIDE

Shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough establish on an areawide basis the hours of sale of all alcoholic beverages? **PASSED**

*A **"YES"** vote means: That alcoholic beverages could not be sold for consumption on licensed premises in the borough Monday through Friday between 2:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and Saturday and Sunday between 3:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. and that the authority to regulate the hours of sale of all alcoholic beverages would be an areawide basis. – **10619**

A "No" vote means: That the hours of sale could be regulated by both the cities and the borough. Under state law, alcoholic beverages can be sold between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. – 8991

Proposition B

PROHIBIT CRUELTY TO DOMESTIC ANIMALS

Shall the Fairbanks North Star Borough exercise the power to prohibit cruelty to domestic animals on an areawide basis? **PASSED**

*A **"Yes"** vote means: The borough would have the authority to prohibit cruelty to all domestic animals. - **12844**

A "No" vote means: The borough would only have the authority to prohibit cruelty to dogs. – 6660

Proposition C

REVENUE TAX CAP – Initiative

Shall Sections 3.08.141 and 3.08.142 of the Fairbanks North Star Borough Code of Ordinances be enacted as Follows: These sections will provide for limitations on the maximum allowable tax revenues for the Fairbanks North Star Borough. Under Section 3.08.141 the borough will be able to levy or impose only the same amount of taxes for one fiscal year as the borough levied or imposed for the preceding year, except that the borough can increase the amount of taxes levied or imposed (a) to adjust for inflation; (b) to take into account new buildings and land coming onto the tax rolls; (c) make new payments on bonds; (d) pay for services approved by voters; (e) pay for new legal judgments entered against the borough; and (f) pay for expenses in emergencies. Section 3.08.142 provides a formula and definitions for the limitations of section 3.08.141.

PASSED

*A **“Yes”** vote means: The new section of the code – “Revenue Tax Cap Initiative” – will be adopted, become law and unable to be modified or negated for a period of two years. - **9296**

A **“No”** vote means: The Revenue Tax Cap Initiative will be defeated; however, the current tax cap law in the Code of Ordinances will remain in effect. – 8815
